

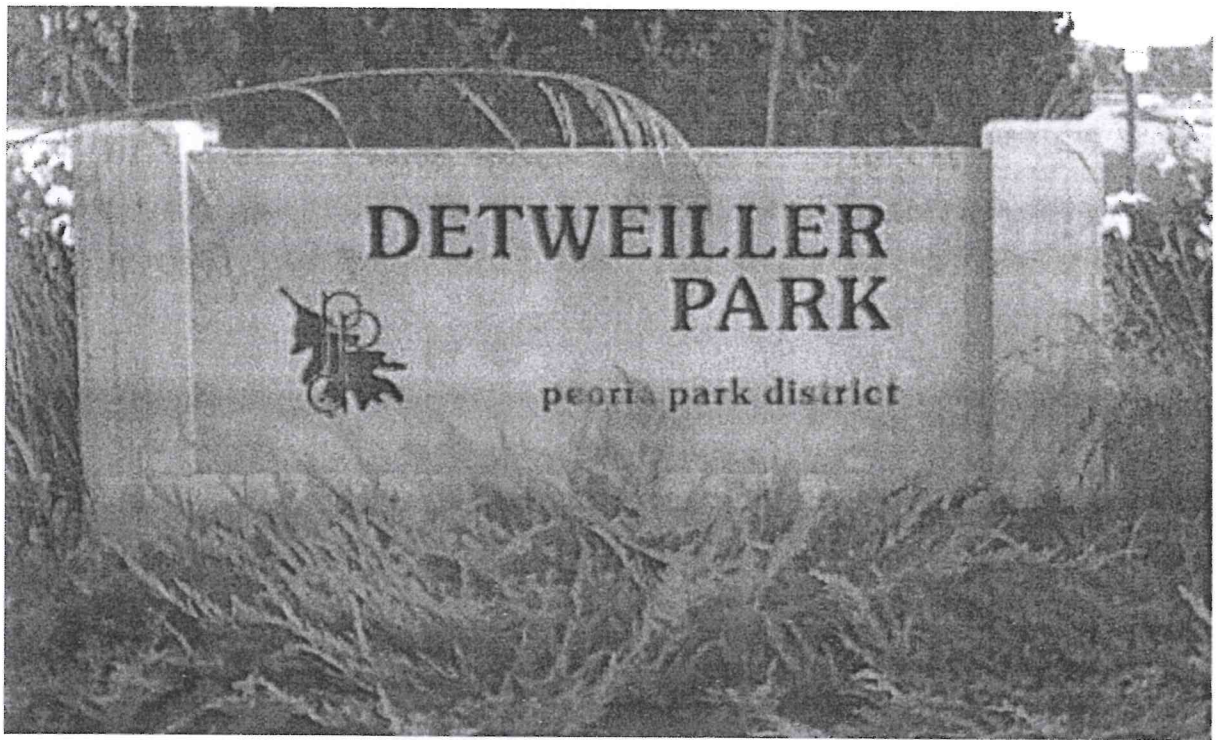

LADY LEAFS ADVANCE TO STATE WHILE BOYS JUST MISS AT THE PEORIA N.D. SECTIONAL

On Saturday, October 27th, Geneseo traveled to East Peoria to participate in the IHSA Sectional Meet. The top 5 teams in each race (girls and boys) along with the top 7 individuals in each race not on qualifying teams. The only exception to this rule is that any individual who placed in the top 10 overall qualified automatically. The meet was hosted by Peoria Notre Dame High School on the campus of Illinois Central College in East Peoria. The weather conditions were certainly different from earlier in the week (Wednesday's high was 81°) but normal for this time of year with a daytime high of 48° and moderate winds. The course was still a bit soggy from the heavy rains earlier in the week.

The Lady Leafs got things rolling with the crack of the starter's gun at 10:00 a.m. sharp. A "refreshing" 37 degrees greeted the Lady Leafs but it didn't take them long to get things warmed up. The entire team got out nicely and really fought well. Since I was not in attendance (24-hour stomach flu) I am going off of Mrs. Fredericks' "blow-by-blow" race broadcast on her cell phone. She did a great job of keeping her hubby informed. Emily rolled by the mile in the top ten while Halle, Maggie, and Lauren came by 30ish. Not far off that pace were Taylor, Katie, and Morgan. The girls looked great and the Leaf support crew (NUMEROUS IN NUMBERS) was observed smiling. Em's blistering early pace caused her to drop back a bit (ended up a solid 19th)

while hard-charging fellow senior Maggie Schlindwein and junior Halle Olson both cracked the top 30 with their 24th and 29th place finishes. Sophomore Katie Puls and freshman Taylor Claus each dug deep and cracked the top 40 with their 35th and 40th place finishes. Not far behind them were freshman Lauren Coulter (58th after a brave early move) and junior Morgan Kelly (75th.) When the dust had settled and the points had been counted, the Lady Leafs were 3rd as a team and headed to the STATE FINALS (not bad for being seeded anywhere from 4th to 6th depending on which websites you looked at.) Great team effort, Ladies. Look out Detweiller.....here you come.

Not too far behind him was fellow senior Mitchell Lawson who was running the race of his life. Mitchell ended up with a sparkling 23rd place finish and missed the big dance by only 5 seconds. Great effort. Next up was the dynamic duo of David Chenoweth and Nick Fox who have been within a step of each other almost the entire season. They roared into the finish chute in 54th and 56th places. Not bad for a couple of youngsters (a sophomore and a freshman.) Up next were our "Big 3" juniors who rolled home in 71st, 80th, and 98th places respectfully for Mitchell Lamb, Chaise Blakley, and Tony Gatter. Next year's dreams will start with you three. Let's support "Stark" in Saturday's STATE FINALS as he chases his dream of wearing an ALL-STATE MEDAL. Great efforts, Men!

At the First to the Finish cross country race in early September, only one team finished ahead of the Alleman boys in the elite cross country 1A team race, and it was the Pioneers' sectional rival Winnebago.

Alleman left no doubt about who was the elite team Saturday at the 1A Oregon Sectional, earning a trip to next weekend's IHSA State meet at Peoria's Detweiller Park in dominating fashion with 74 team points over runner up Winnebago's 124.

"I expected it to be much closer," Alleman coach Doug Burke said. "I really think that our team responded very well, and produced a wide margin of victory."

The Pioneers' Ethan Adlfinger (15:52) surged ahead in the

final 200 meters to win his first individual sectional title, and the Pioneers Zach Hird wasn't far off, finishing in eighth (16:30).

"I think Ethan's focus is on how far the team can go," said Burke of his pack that was separated by only 1-minute, 20-seconds from first-to-fifth. "Everyone wants to race to the front for him because he's a good leader. I think we get better every week."

It was the first team sectional win for Alleman since the 2004 season when the Pioneers won the state championship.

Annawan-Wethersfield's Michael Cook (16:29) advanced individually out of the Oregon field.

At the 1A Elmwood Sectional, Monmouth-Roseville's Devin Clark earned his second state berth (15:45), but the Titans boys team landed two points short of a fifth-place spot and a state appearance.

The Titans' girls team fared much better, clinching the fifth and final spot at the 1A Elmwood Sectional. Monmouth Roseville's Destiny Smith (20, 19:41) and Brit-tany Daniel (22, 19:45) led the run to state.

At the 2A Peoria Notre Dame Sectional, United Township's Austin Webster finished second and Tyler Rasso was fourth as the Panthers team finished third overall and punched their ticket to state.

"Austin and Tyler pulled out to about a five second lead early," United Township coach Russ Boore said. "Brendan Hoskins is a big tall guy with long legs, and he reeled them in about the half way point. I'm proud of my guys; it was a gutsy move, and they hung in there and finished second and fourth."

Geneseo's Jordan Starkey (15:33) reached the state meet as the top

individual advancing from the Peoria Notre Dame Regional, but the team did not make it through, finishing eighth.

The Maple Leafs girls team was an incredibly tight pack that was separated by only 27 seconds as they reached their goal of returning to state as a team for the first time since their magical fourth-place run in 2009.

They did it without Coach Don Fredericks, who was unable to be at the meet because of an illness.

Geneseo was paced by Emily Ford's 19th-place finish in 19:17.

"I asked Emily what means more to you 'going as an individual, and earning all state or going as a team?'" said Fredericks. "She said 'as a team' and it's a really special group and a lot of really special teams never get a chance to run in the state finals — I'm really glad this was attained by our team."

At the 3A Normal Community Sectional, Moline's Haley Verbeke (17:41) earned an appearance in her fourth consecutive state meet with a second-place finish and Brisa Almanza cracked the Top 10 with a ninth-place finish (18:19).

Verbeke and Normal Community's Carly Pederson battled down the stretch for the sectional individual title, but Pederson was able to hold off Verbeke at the finish.

"Haley came back on her in the last half mile," Moline coach Tauwon Taylor said. "With 200 meters to go, Haley pulled up along her shoulder getting ready to pass, and Carly kind of took off and had another gear."

The Maroons will make their second consecutive team state appearance, looking to improve on last seasons 24th-place finish.

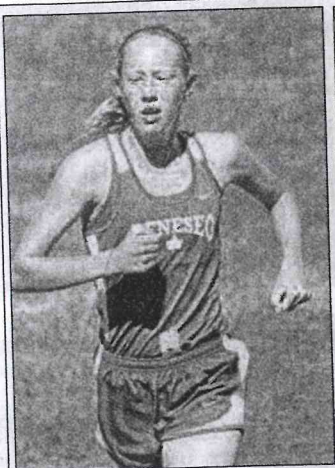
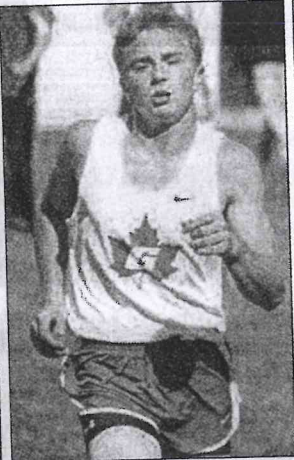

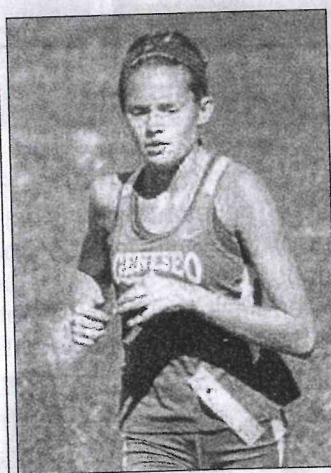

HALLE OLSON keeps her stride.

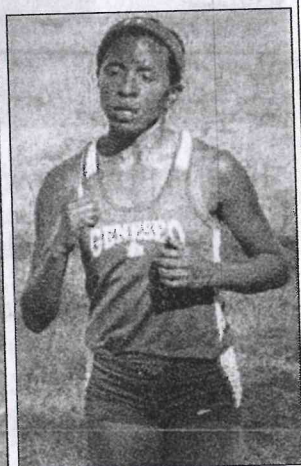

GHS girls, Starkey head to state

The Geneseo girls' cross country team and senior boys' runner Jordan Starkey have a date at state after the Lady Leafs and Starkey both advanced out of the Oct. 27 Peoria Notre Dame Sectional.

"It was very exciting and I am proud of them," said head coach Don Fredericks.

The Lady Leafs placed third as a team to earn their spot in the state finals.

"The girls were ranked eighth going into regionals and depending on what Web site you look at they were ranked fourth, fifth or sixth

for sectionals and got third," said Fredericks. "They outperformed all of those. They ran great and everybody ran tough."

Emily Ford paced the team with a 19th-place finish with a time of 19 minutes and 17 seconds, followed by Maggie Schlindwein in 23rd at 19:21.

Halle Olson came in 28th at 19:27, while Katie Puls took home 34th in 19:36. Taylor Claus finished 39th overall in 19:44, followed by Lauren Coulter in 57th at 20:07 and Morgan Kelly, 73rd at 20:25.

"All seven ran tough,"

said Fredericks. "Maggie was our second girl and that is the first time that happened. She went nuts. She and Katie Puls stepped up big time.

"I am really happy for them because there are a lot of deserving teams that never get the chance to run in the state finals, and luckily that is not the case for us."

Starkey punched his ticket to state with a sixth-place finish in the boys' race as he crossed the finish line in 15:33.

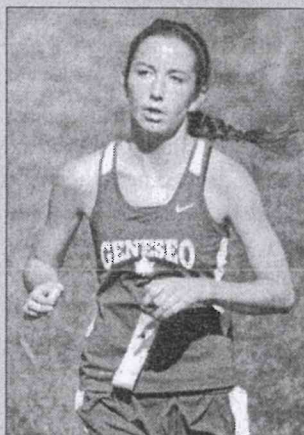
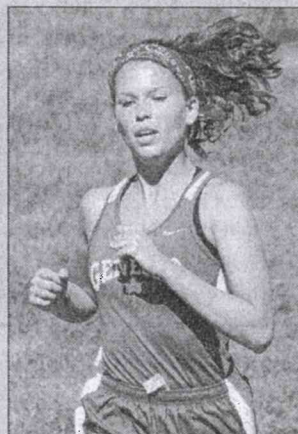
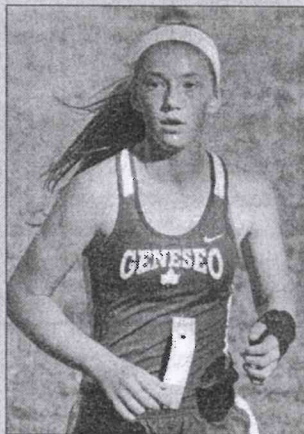
"My goal for Jordan was Top 10, which was quite an assignment," said Fredericks. "He got sixth and was banging heads with the big dogs."

The boys' team placed eighth overall.

"The boys ran great and just missed out," said Fredericks. "Honestly until the points were announced we didn't know because it was that close."

Other finishers falling short of advancing were Mitchell Lawson, 23rd, 16:02; David Chenoweth, 54th, 16:36; Nick Fox, 56th, 16:36; Mitchell Lamb, 71st, 16:57; Chaise Blakley, 80th, 17:05; and Tony Gatter, 98th, 17:21.

"Mitchell Lawson just missed qualifying by 5 sec-

onds and that was by far the best race of his life," said Fredericks. "I am proud of the boys. They had a great season."

The Lady Leafs and Starkey will compete at the IHSA State Finals Nov. 3. The girls will race at 11 a.m., followed by the boys' race at noon.

"(The state finals) are pretty competitive and it is

the best of the best," said Fredericks. "We are honored to be there. We are certainly going to race and not just participate.

"Jordan's goal is to be All-State and our top girls would love to achieve that as well. We are going to try to run for personal bests and the goal is to run the best race the last time you race. That is my goal for all eight of them."
