Geneseo Places Third in Cross Country Events

Geneseo tied for third in the first Geneseo Invitational cross country meet held Saturday, Sept. 23. Princeton was the winner and Sterling took second.

The eleven participating schools and the points they scored were: Princeton 43, Sterling 45, Geneseo 138, La Salle-Peru 138, Alleman 141, Winola 163, Kewanee 170, Rock Falls 180, Monmouth 193, Prophetstown 251, and Wethersfield 281.

The individual winner was Tom Swan of Princeton who ran the 1.98 mile course in 9:56.1.

PHS Runners Win

Invitational At Geneseo;

Tom Swan First

Princeton's varsity cross country runners distinguished themselves Saturday by winning top honors in the Geneseo Invitational meet. Coach Jim Wilson's Tigers tallied 43 points for the number one spot against 12 other schools, and junior Tom Swan was the individual winner in a time of 9:56.1 in a field that included 90 contestants. Princeton nosed out NCIC rival Sterling, the latter team scoring 45 points. Rounding out the top five were LaSalle-Peru with 138, Geneseo

with 139, and Rock Island Alleman with 141.

Princeton's placings for the meet were Tom Swan (1); Rick Fundell (5); Pat Bougamont (8); Rick Allen (9); and Craig Bryant (20). Clarence Taylor was

31st, and Bob Blakely 33rd.

Sterling's runners finished 4-6-7-13-15. Thursday, Sept. 28, Princeton hosts St. Bede in a varsity and frosh-soph dual meet. Tuesday, Oct. 3, Princeton and Rock Falls are at Mendota, and Thursday, Oct. 5, Princeton will be after the top team spot in the Kewanee Invitational.
