

X-Country Team Wins Kewanee Invitational; Swan 10th In Row

Princeton's varsity cross country team won their second major trophy of the season Thursday afternoon, emerging victorious in the seven-team Kewanee Invitational. Coach Jim Wilson's fine group had five runners in the first 10 places for a low total of 25 points, 40 points ahead of second place Winola. Following in order were Geneseo, Kewanee, Wethersfield, Morrison, and Prophetstown.

Tom Swan chalked up his 10th straight individual season win, setting a new course and

meet mark with a time to 10:05. Rick Fundell was third, Pat Bougamont was fifth, Craig Bryant sixth, Rick Allen 10 to complete Princeton's scoring.

Bob Blakely was 15th and "Buster" Taylor 16th in the field of 49 runners. Thursday Oct. 12, Princeton hosts Mendota in a dual varsity and frosh-soph meet.
