Princeton's Runners Score 3-Way Win

Princeton's harriers made a "clean sweep" of things Thursday on their home course in the finale of dual competition for the season against Geneseo. The varsity, scoring a 1-2-3-6-7 finish, won going away 19 to 42. The junior varsity runners, paced by Greg Johnson, scored an 18 to 40 triumph and the frosh-soph contingent defeated the visitors 23 to 36.

The PHS varsity finished the season with a 13-2 dual record including their last seven in a row. The J-V's were 1-0 for the year, and the frosh-soph concluded with an 8-5 mark.

PAT BOUGAMONT was the individual varsity winner with a time of 10:15. Craig Bryant was the number two, Rick Fundell number three. "Buster" Taylor was sixth, and Rick Allen seventh.
