E.M. Moline harriers qualify for state meet

PEORIA — East Moline and Moline's cross-country teams finished second and third, respectively, but they both qualified for next week's state meet after Saturday's sectional running in Peoria.

Peoria Central won the team title with 53 points followed by the Panthers with 64 and the Maroons with 73. Rockridge and Rock Island finished well back with 288 and 303 team points.

Dana Hiserote of Peoria Central was individual champ with a 14:35 timing on the three-mile course. East Moline's Jack Remaster finished second and Moline's Dave Howell took eighth in the 15-team sectional meet.

Other East Moline finishes

included Larry Ballegeer 7th, Paul Kimmell 8th, John Alonzo 21st, Jay Robinson 26th, Joe Gonzalez 60th and Craig Hendrichs 64th.

Other Moline finishes were Dave VanVooren 9th, Steve Decker 12th, Paul Eberhardt 18th, Randy Willems 28th, Dave Rempe 34th and Bruce Nelson 66th.

The state meet will also be at Detweiller Park in Peoria next Saturday.

Central, Hiserote Capture Sectional; Primed For State Bid

"The top team from here will be lucky to place in the top five in the state meet," said Moline cross-country coach Gene Shipley late Saturday morning, "or maybe the top ten."

Central's cross-country team would take exception.

"WE feel like we're ready, like we're capable of mixing it up with anyone," says Cen-

tral coach Bob LaCroix.

Now, guess which coach's team won the Limestone Sectional Saturday at Detweiller Park.

Central's Lions continued building toward what they hope will be a state meet peak by capturing the sectional championship. East Moline, second with 64 points, and Moline, which disappointed its coach Shipley

with 73 points, also qualified for the state meet.

The top three teams and first 10 individuals from sectionals throughout the state qualified yesterday for next Saturday's state meet at Detweiller.

BOTH CENTRAL and star runner Dana Hiserote gained a measure of revenge Saturday. Moline had beaten the Lions twice in invitational

meets this season, while East Moline's Jack Lemaster had defeated Hissrote twice.

Saturday was Hissrote's. He pulled away from Lemaster with a half mile to go and raced to a four-second victory in 14:36—not a bad time considering the chilly, piercing rain — and a sectional course record.

"The cold and rain doesn't bother runners too much," LaCroix explained. "They're warm inside. A wet, slippery ground is a problem, particularly for a power runner like Hissrote."

Hissrote affirmed that the unsure footing bothered him. He was more impressed, though, hardly bothered, by an attempt by Lemaster to "psych him."

"HE KEPT talking to me, saying things like 'Take it easy, we got a long way to go,'" reported Hissrote.

Lemaster, who didn't run two weeks prior to Tuesday's district because of shin splints, had both legs iced to the point of numbness before the race. But neither his inability to stride out early or the pain that returned later appeared to affect him during the race.

HE AND Hissrote moved to the front after a mile and continued to trade off as they went past two miles, made the turn and headed north by Galena Road. There they

went all out for nearly a quarter of a mile. "Dana told me he couldn't have run any faster," said LaCroix until Hissrote pulled away.

East Peoria's Mike Freeman and Richwoods' Steve Patterson finished third and fifth respectively, while Bill Bandy of Chillicothe also earned a spot in the state field with a seventh place finish.

"It hasn't been easy for Mike," said East Peoria coach John Crusier. With his team eliminated in the district, Freeman has practiced alone at Detweiller during the week.

Central had 22 points through its first three runners to East Moline's 17, but Bruce Baumgartner and Bob Ulrich added 14th and 17th for the Lions, while East Moline's fourth and fifth runners were 21st and 26th.

East Moline's strong showing from its second and third

runners pretty well closed out Spalding's hopes for packing its runners high enough to earn third place.

With top runner Larry O'Donnell slowed by flu, the Irish finished fifth, followed directly by Richwoods, Metamora, Chillicothe IVC and Pekin.
