Major cross country event to be hosted by Geneseo

The second major cross country spectator attraction of the season in Geneseo will be conducted this Saturday morning at 11 when Geneseo high hosts the Maple Leaf Run at Richmond Hill park.

The first major fan attraction was the Geneseo Invitational, and Leaf Coach Steve Durian said the spectators who turned out for that one seemed to enjoy

The course at Richmond Hill park is a challenging, 2.8 mile layout. Spectators can see the start and finish and about half the race if they gather in the picnic area atop the hill in the park.

The Geneseo Invitational attracted a number of the larger schools. The Maple Leaf Run will feature mostly smaller schools.

Included in the 13-team field are Canton, DePue, Elmwood, Farmington, Hall, Monmouth, Prophetstown, Rockridge, St. Bede, Westmer, Winola, Peoria Woodruff, and the hosting Maple

Woodruff, Prophetstown and Elmwood appear to be the class of this field. Geneseo should be in the top five, and with a good day, could crack into the top three.

That would be most pleasant, because team trophies are awarded to the top three squads. Also, the first 10 individuals win medals.

The idea for having a Geneseo-Invitational, with larger schools, and a Maple Leaf Run, featuring smaller schools, carries over into track, and Durian credits retired Leaf Athletic Director John McCormick for developing the concept.

"I like it," said Durian. "It offers our athletes and fans a nice variety of teams during the year."

Junior Jeff Fitzgerald was named this week's runner of the week for Geneseo by Coach Durian.

With its best effort of the season, Geneseo's varsity cross country team placed fourth last Saturday in the Maple Leaf Run at Richmond Hill Park.

Mark Nordstrom paced the Leafs with an 11th place finish—he missed a medal by one place—and a 15:16 clocking on Geneseo's 2.8-mile course, the best time this season by a Leaf runner.

Winner of the Maple Leaf Run was John Isbell of Farmington, who knocked a minute off the course record with a 13:38.0 cruise.

The meet attracted 70 runners from 11 schools and a number of spectators.
