

# Riverdale, MerCo eye strong finishes

First-time state participants not just happy to be there

Back after a one-year hiatus, the IHSA state cross country meet in Peoria will feature a pair of newcomers to the Class 1A team sweepstakes.

The Riverdale boys squad and the Mercer County girls harriers will be making their debuts Saturday morning at Detweiler Park after qualifying out of the rugged Oregon Sectional.

Finishing second only behind Rockford Christian in the boys sectional at Oregon Park West, the Rams continue a stellar season that has produced team titles at the Three Rivers Conference and Rock Falls Regional meets.

"Last year we would've qualified for state, but it didn't happen," said Riverdale coach Kevin Claus, referring to the cancellation of the 2020 state meet because of the COVID-19 pandemic; his squad's fourth-place sectional finish last fall would have sent them on to Detweiler.

"This season, everyone's stepped up and rallied around the goal of getting to state. That's been the mentality all year — to go to state and to do well there."

Meanwhile, the Mercer County girls squad also had high hopes for a postseason breakthrough after a

strong regular season that included a first-place finish at the Lincoln Trail Conference meet.

After finishing second to regional host Rock Falls the weekend prior to sectionals, MerCo coach Peter Nelson felt the prospects for a team state date were good, but he was not about to take anything for granted.

"There were still some doubts, there was still a job to do at sectionals," he said. "When I saw all seven cross the line, I knew we had made it. I knew if they did what they had done all year. That gave me confidence (about advancing to state)."

"The girls have been consistently showing improvement all season. I knew they just had to run their normal race last Saturday."

Finishing third at Oregon, just 13 points behind runner-up Seneca (Winnebago won the team title decisively), the Golden Eagles had four of their seven runners finish among the top 50, a quartet led by junior standout Eden Mueller.

Mueller was the highest-placing area individual in the girls' competition at Oregon, hitting the finish in sixth place with a time of 20:00.51.

"Eden did a lot of hard training this past summer and into the fall, and everything's really falling into place for her," Nelson said. "She's really turned it on the last couple of meets."

For the Riverdale boys, junior

of the Rams' seven runners finish in the top 30, including fellow junior Landis Musser (fifth place in 16:46.43).

Such performances have Claus feeling that his squad can post a top 5 finish in its state debut or even return home with a trophy for a top 3 finish.

"Our fourth and fifth runners (seniors Cameron Overton and Caden Ludin) had great races at sectionals; they've both improved quite a bit over the season," he said. "We've got a great group that was willing to do more over the summer, and right now, I like what our team is doing."

# Murray, Anderson shine at state

PEORIA — Saturday morning saw several of the area's premier cross country talents rising along with the sun.

Making their debuts at the IHSA Class 1A state meet, both the Riverdale boys' squad and Annawan-Wethersfield sophomore phenom Kennady Anderson shined just as brightly.

In the 1A girls' race that got proceedings underway at Detweiller Park, Anderson turned in a personal-best time of 18:29.31, good enough to earn her an All-State finish by placing 24th.

"My goal was to definitely get top 25," she said. "I'd never ran at Detweiller before; every time we ran there, I had a volleyball tournament on the same day. Everyone told me it was a fast course, so I was hoping to get a P.R."

Unlike last fall, Anderson juggled cross country and volleyball schedules, playing a key role in the latter sport for a Wethersfield squad that posted a 23-12 record.

"It was definitely difficult," she said. "I was nervous that I wouldn't get top 25, especially since all of my cross country training was on a treadmill, and not outdoors. I didn't go to any practices until last week, so it was mostly running on my own."

"I was really nervous, running against the best in the state. I just wanted to give it my all."

In the 1A boys' meet, the Rams marked their first appearance at Detweiller by finishing 11th out of 30 teams. Their score of 324 points finished just 20 shy of a top 10 team showing.

Junior standout Tommy Murray led the way for Riverdale with the best showing of any local runner. He finished in ninth place after covering the three-mile course in 15:17.01, less than a second off his career best.

"We were never disappointed with (11th place)," said Murray. "I'm proud of the team and all of the work we put in, and all the love we share for the sport. I was happy we got to go to state in the first place. We've only been around since 2019, so to get here that fast is a monumental achievement."

"I was really shooting to break 15

minutes, but I wasn't able to do it. Place-wise, I'm really happy with (ninth). Where I expected to be is where I ended up being."

Murray's junior teammate Landis Musser also joined the All-State rankings, hitting the finish line in 15:33.91 to finish 24th.

That doubles the list of Riverdale boys' runners to earn All-State, as Murray and Musser join two-time All-Stater Dorian Ulrey (2004, '05) and Josh Moshier ('06).

**1A roundup:** Another team making its state debut was the Mercer County girls' squad, and the Golden Eagles finished in 20th place in the 1A competition, led by junior Eden Mueller's 48th-place, 18:59.10 clocking.

Mueller finished one spot ahead of Ridgewood sophomore Miranda Reed, who turned in a time of 18:59.30 in her first state meet. Another first-time state competitor, Orion sophomore Olivia Thomsen,

posted a time of 19:29.97 to finish 90th.

Sherrard finished 28th in the girls' team standings with a score of 645 points, led by sophomore Madison Mathis (144th place, 20:08.13).

In the 1A boys' meet, Erie-Prophetstown (777 points) finished 30th behind the sophomore duo of Jacob Gibson (181st, 17:12.96) and Lucas Dreisbach (182nd, 17:13.42). Individually, Kewanee senior Colin Vanstechelman put up a time of 16:49.30 to finish 136th out of 260 runners.

**2A roundup:** In Saturday's Class 2A boys' meet, the Geneseo Maple Leafs finished in 25th place among 28 teams with a score of 575 points as junior Gavin Allison (16:10.89) cracked the top 100 with a 96th-place finish.

The Lady Leafs' junior standout Jaide Flowers finished in 108th place with a 19:17.22 clocking.



## From last to first, Fenwick takes home 2A Boys State title

### Partlow pulls away from Georges in last half of race to claim individual title

Peoria, Ill – The last time that Fenwick left Detweiller Park after a state meet, the Friars had finished last out of 26 teams. This state meet Saturday at Peoria's Detweiller Park was a little different.

Fenwick had some hardware to bring back to the Oak Park school. There were no clouds to cover the sunshine and the spotlight that this team deserved.

"We wanted to make this race like a bandaid," Fenwick runner **Lee O'Bryan** said. "We wanted to make it hurt and make it fast."

Fenwick led at the mile and never let up on that pressure. They scored 120 points to win their first state title in the program's history. Fenwick becomes the second team to go from last to first in consecutive state meets in IHSA Boys State Meet history. Petersburg PORTA achieved that by finishing 20th in the 1978 Class A and then winning in 1979.

This was going to be a loaded race with Morton who won by two points ahead of Fenwick a month before on this course, and a up and coming Deerfield team their top competition in this meet. The race the month before in Peoria got Fenwick's attention.

"We came into that meet as the #1 team," added O'Bryan. "It was like a kick in the pants. It made us work even harder so we would be ready for today."

Five runners finished in the top 87. Two of those runners, **Grayden Rill** (8th) and **Nathaniel McKillop** (20th), earned all-state honors. Dean O'Bryan (33rd), Zac Daley (43rd), and Lee O'Bryan (87th) completed Fenwick's scoring top five.

Deerfield ran a great race in finishing second with 141 points. **Lucas Moskovitz** was all-state finishing 10th. He was followed by **Ryan Bernstein** (35th), **Cole Bernstein** (46th), **Carter Levinson** (63rd), and **Evan Morris** (63rd) followed.

Morton finished third (164 points) with **Cade Zobrist** all-state finishing ninth. There was a 25 second split from their second through fifth runners with **Josh Weeks** (39th), **Yonas Wuthrich** (52nd), **Keegan Anderson** (65th), and **Layton Knoop** (86th) part of that group.

Kaneland finished fourth (185 points) again led by freshman **Evan Nosek** and his all-state 21st place finish. Riverside-Brookfield placed 3 runners in the top 30 to finish fifth (235 points). **Paul Proteau** led the Bulldogs (3rd). **Cooper Marrs** struggled to cross the line, but he did in a 22nd place all-state finish.

The individual race was also a repeat in some way in what we saw at the Peoria Invitational the month before. The outcome of that race was the same on Saturday.

**Alex Partlow** of Carbondale broke away from **Wilson Georges** of Limestone in the back triangle of the course, then pulled away to run 14:11.9 for the state title. It was the second fastest time of the day on this course. Georges ran a personal best of 14:36 to finish second.

Partlow and Georges set the fast pace early passing the first mile in 4:37. A pack with **Jake Phillips** of Marist, **Michael Schumacher** of St. Viator, **Yusuf Baig** of Burlington Central, and Proteau were five seconds back.

Partlow's move opened the race as he passed 2-miles in 9:27 with his momentum continuing to increase. Georges had dropped back eight seconds after that pass. Partlow hammered the final mile in 4:44 to cross the line as the state champion. Georges still looked strong as he crossed the line almost 25 seconds later.

Proteau closed in 4:49 to finish third (14:44). Phillips (14:50) and Baig (14:51) finished close together.

## **LEAFS PLACE 26TH AT STATE**

On Saturday, November 6th, the Leafs headed to Peoria's "Historic" Detweiller Park to participate in the 2021 IHSA State 2A Cross Country State Championship. The field included teams from the following schools: Bartonville (Limestone), Belvidere (North), Champaign (Central), Chicago (Mather), Chicago (Payton), Crystal Lake (Central), Deerfield, Dunlap, Geneseo, Glen Ellyn (Glenbard South), Grayslake (Central), Highland, Lake Villa (Lakes), Mahomet (M.-Seymour), Maple Park (Kaneland), Marian (H.S.), Morton, Mt. Zion, Normal (Community West), Oak Park (Fenwick), Peoria (Notre Dame), Riverside (R.-Brookfield), Springfield (H.S.), Sycamore, Urbana (H.S.), Washington, Wheaton (St. Francis), and Woodstock. In addition, there were 40 Individual Qualifiers. On the line were "Trophies" to the Top 3 finishing teams and Individual "All-State" Medals to the top 25 Finishers.

The weatherman gave us a day that will be hard to duplicate in the years to come. The daytime high was 67° and the wind was not a factor (9 mph SSW) due to the fact that Detweiller Park sits in the "Illinois River Valley" and is protected from most winds by heavily wooded areas. Even

though this was the second year in a row that the Geneseo Boys have qualified for the State Meet, it should be noted that there was NO State Meet held last fall. The IHSA Qualification "Trail" ended at the Sectional Meet Level due to COVID-19 concerns. The team did compete in the "Shazam" Championship" but since there was no "Official" State Meet, this year marked 22 years since the Maple Leafs competed in the State Finals. That last happened in 1999. None of the current team was even born yet. Geneseo has had a "plethora" of "Heartbreaking Near Misses" during that time span. Congratulations to last year's team for "Ending the Drought" and "Kicking that Door DOWN". Ditto for this year's team for making it "Back-to-Back" qualifying.

Head Cross Country Coaches Todd Ehlert (Boys) and Kelley Timmerman (Girls) put their heads together and decided to share a "Tour Bus". It was AWESOME to see each team travel together and they certainly traveled in "Style". The "sleek" Black Streamlined Tour Bus turned more than a few heads when it rolled into Detweiller Park. It was also great to see each team go "All In" in regards to supporting each other. That is a "Win-Win" and should be here to stay. Hopefully, so is Qualifying for the State Finals. Thus, traveling "In Style" is hopefully, going to become an annual occurrence and it would be wonderful to ride the same bus down to Peoria for many years to come. ### TOUR BUS AND "da TEAM"

Onto the race. The race time temperature was somewhere in the low 50's when the 2A boys took off at "High Noon". The course was Hard and Fast. It has been estimated that there were OVER 10,000 Fans at the Park. It was an awesome day and very cool to see the Leafs competing. The Leafs were led by the "Dynamic Duo" of Junior Gavin Allison and Senior Justin Johnson. The two men have traded off on being the Leafs' number one man all season long and have run most of every race this season so close to each other that they could reach out and literally touch each other. Gavin "Cracked" the Top 100 with his 96th place finish. He was clocked in a personal best

time of 16:10. Justin was just off his best time. He ran a gutsy race and "Clocked" 16:24 which gave him 136th place. Next up was Junior Tyler Gehl who tied his "Lifetime Best" and was timed in 16:41 and placed 161st. The rest of the team were all within 11 seconds of each other and finished their races Sprinting HARD as they "Swarmed In" It was cool to hear Matt Piescinski (The Voice of the IHSA XC and Track & Field Competitions" comment..."And here comes Geneseo". That was a pretty sweat moment. The "Next Man Up" for the Leafs was Sophomore Cooper Schaad who placed 176th and ran a "Lifetime Best" of 16:50. The next two Leafs "Clocked" the same time of 16:58. Senior Isaac Kuster had battled severe major breathing issues all season long and still ran a "Lifetime Best" of 16:58 and placed 190th. Freshman "Phenom" Dylan Gehl placed one position behind Isaac and also recorded a "Personal Best". Dylan's time of 16:58 is the 10th Fastest Time for a Geneseo Freshman EVER on the "Historic" Detweiller Park Course. Most of the courses that we race on have changed a lot so most of the current courses haven't been around too long. That is NOT the case here. The Detweiller Park Lists are the closest thing we have to "School Records" in Cross Country. "Cracking" the Top 10 is VERY Impressive. Way to Go, Dylan. Ending the competition for the Leafs was Sophomore Sam Mosbarger who sprinted across the line in 196th Place. Sam was timed in a "Lifetime " best of 17:01. Way to Roll, Men. In case you weren't counting, that was SIX LIFETIME BESTS. Not too bad. The only man who didn't record a "Lifetime Best" was close to his best time. The bottom line is the Leafs ran GREAT. What more could we expect from them?

When the "Dust had Settled", the Leafs found themselves 26th in the 2A State Finals. I think we were all hoping for more but who wouldn't? The State Championship team was probably the only team that was completely satisfied. Having "Lofty Goals" is a good thing but there is no reason for anyone to "Hang their Heads". We are VERY proud of each and every one of you. It has truly been a "Magical Season". I hate to see it end. The "Banquet" should be "Epic". The "Senior Speeches" are going to be inspiring. Seniors, remember to type print a copy for me so I can add it to our Cross Country Yearbook.

A special "Shout Out" goes to the "Hype Squad". You guys were EVERYWHERE. There is zero doubt that you helped each of "The Geneseo Top 7" run a little faster every time they saw or heard you. Seniors Carson Raya and Malakai Schaad were the "Leaders" of the "Hype Squad" and will be leaving some Big Shoes to be filled in future years. Knowing this team, there is NO doubt that we will have people "Step Up" and "Fill Those Roles" when the time comes. Congratulations on a wonderful season, Men. All the best to all of you. We hope to see most of you when Track and Field Season Rolls Around. We also hope to see most (if not all) of the team's Non-Seniors back on the team in the Fall of 2022. 

## James goes in the final mile to capture an elusive 1A Boys state title

## Rogers finishes second; Latin School wins tight and emotional team title.

Peoria, Ill – Cool conditions covered by a sun filled cloudless sky set up great racing condition of the three Boys races Saturday at Peoria's Detweiller Park.

A state championship that seemed to elude **Ryder James** of Paxton-Buckley-Loda during his high school career came into his possession as a strong move in the last mile to win the 1A Boys individual championship running a fast 14:16. **Drew Rogers** of Herscher ran 14:29 to finish second.

Rogers won two state titles on the track last June. He won an IHSA title when this meet was last held in 2019. The IHSA Meet was not held in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

This was one of the toughest individual fields of the six races on this day. Rogers, James, **Miles Sheppard** of Hamilton-West Hancock, **Gavin Genisio** of Benton, and **Daniel Winkelman** of Harvest Christian Academy were all together at the mile as the group passed in 4:42.

Minor surges were made in the triangle portion of the course but none of that group broke away. James made a move just before 3-miles that opened the pack wide-open as James burst to the lead. Shepard and Rogers were together 5-meters behind James as he passed two-miles in 9:36. Genisio and Winkleman had dropped back 20-meters from the front.

What was not known by most people around the course was that Rogers had injured his foot at the Naperville Twilight Invitational on October 6. He did not use that as an excuse finishing second behind his longtime friend.

"I thought it would get better, but it did not. Trying to do speed work or workouts on the track made it hurt more," Rogers said. "I rested the last two weeks. I really wanted to run today. The best thing of today is that Ruder won and that we went 1-2."

It was ironic that both runners have made verbal commitments to the University of Missouri next fall. They will be able to run together this time in the same jersey. This day in November belonged to James.

"It's a beautiful moment. Every day since sixth grade I have envisioned this moment. Now I get to live it out," an emotional James said after his win. "I came up to 400 to go and heard it is all yours. I did not want to believe that. We (Rogers) wanted to go 1-2. We have been thinking about that our freshmen year. It was going to eventually happen. It just happened today."

Sheppard ran a personal best of 14:31 to finish third. Winkelman ran 14:42 to finish fourth. **Issac Teel** of Pinckneyville passed Genisio to run 14:45 to finish fifth. Genisio ran 14:46 to place sixth.

Latin School used the power from their top three runners and strong finishes from their fourth and fifth runners gave them the edge to win the first state title for the Boys program with 165 points. Arthur-Lovington-Atwood-Hammond was close as they scored 172 points to finish second.

The inspiration of the day was a heroic finish from the team's fourth runner **Daniel Goodman**. Latin School already had three all-state runners that had crossed the line with **Ryan Hardiman** in 8th, **Akili Parekh** in 10th, and **Ben Gibson** in 20th. Some had said that this team could not win a state title with the gap between the group and the fourth and fifth runners was too big earlier in the year. The Romans changed the narrative in this meet.

"I read something before today saying that we could not win because our 4-5 was too far behind," Goodman said. "I wanted to prove them wrong."

Goodman approached the finish line having given everything that he had. He had overexerted himself so much that he collapsed 10-meters away the finish. His coaches on the sidelines yelled at him to get up. He got up and threw himself over the line finishing 97th. Their fifth runner was **Jackson Ballard** finishing 106th. Goodman willing himself across the finish line secured the state title for his team.

Latin School ran a 94 second split on their top five runners. Their splits the two previous weeks were 95 seconds and 91 seconds. They proved their doubters wrong.

Arthur-Lovington had **Logan Beckmier** as their lone all-state runner as he finished (13th). **Jace Green** (28th), **Jacob Adcock** (45th), and **Lyle Adcock** (47th) were the team's second through four runners. Jacob Duzan was the team's fifth runner as he finished in 123rd. The Knights' split of 83 seconds was their best of this season.

DePaul College Prep concluded a great season by coming home with a trophy finishing third with 186 points. **Mac Kittrell** (16th) and **Charlie Richardson** (25th) led the Rams earning all-state honors. Owen Flom (67th), **Bryan Malkowski** (78th), and **William Beebe** (95th) rounded out the team's top five scorers.

Normal University finished fourth with 193 points led by the 29th place finish from **Brandt Henderson**. Rockford Christian finished fifth (217 points) led by all-state performances from **Ethan Walsh** (14th) and **Weston Forward** (19th).

## Fast start propels Wilson to 3A Boys State Championship

### Sandburg completes two-year journey to state team championship

Peoria, Ill – The final race at Detweiller Park on Saturday is usually the loudest, the one that has most fans swarming from point to point on the course. The first state meet back after a year away because of the COVID-19 pandemic meant we would have a real cross-country championship on a championship course under blue skies with no threat of bad weather.

The final race was perfect. Great racing with a flair of the dramatic

**Micah Wilson** of St. Charles East had learned what he did wrong when he raced a month ago on this course.

“I wasn’t feeling good. It was just before I got sick, Wilson said. “I knew I was better than I showed in that race. I knew if I would have stuck to my race plan, which was not a true showing of what I could do.

Wilson knew that if he was going to win this state title, he would have to completely destroy the pack that would dog his every move if the pace was slower.

The pace was fast as Wilson, **Nick Falk** of New Trier, **Luke Wiley** of Warren, **Riley Newport** of DeKalb, **Declan Tunney** of Sandburg, **Marcellus Mines** of Joliet West, and **Roy Lewellyn** of Downers Grove North were some of the runners that went through the mile in 4:34. The plan was working as the pace was stretching out. It also claimed a casualty in the second mile. Mines had injured his foot at the Quincy Sectional last week. Doctors had cleared him to run. The injury forced him out of the race. He is a sophomore. He will be back.

Wilson continued to put pressure on the rest of the race making a series of moves in the triangle. When he came out and got to the two-mile mark in 9:21.7. Wiley was the closest more than a second behind. Falk was another four seconds back but staying in touch with the lead. Newport was the surprise in the race as he stayed close to both Wiley and Falk and running on the side of Tunney.

Wilson stretched the lead even further with a half mile to go and it looked like he had the win similar to what Josephine Welin had experienced in the 3A Girls race.

Falk was closing on Wilson with his kick that he put on display in the Peoria race a month ago when he ran 14:23 for the win. Wilson heard the crowd, heard the cheering for the New Trier runner, and took one peak behind. He pumped a little harder in his final steps towards the finish line crossing his arms in the air and winning with the fastest time of the day, 14:11.2.

Falk did what he needed to do but just could not get Wilson. He ended a great race running 14:14 to finish second. In most years, that time would have won a state title. Newport moved past Wiley and could not catch Falk as he ran a school record of 14:15.

"I know I wanted this," Wilson added. "I started thinking about people that have influenced me. My coach, my friends, my family. I am so blessed to have this gift. I was so grateful for this race."

Wiley ran 14:19 to finish fourth ahead of Tunney (14:29), Lewellyn (14:31), **Camyn Viger** of Plainfield South (14:31), and **Ryan Watts** of Edwardsville (14:32).

It all started last fall after the Southwest Suburban Conference Meet when several members of Sandburg's Boys Cross Country team were quarantined due to COVID-19. Their successful season was all of a sudden put to a halt. All that happened is that their drive to being the best continued another season.

All of 2021 Sandburg was a step ahead of the rest of the state. When they stepped into Box 3 all they did was write the final chapter of this two-year story.

If there is a perfect race in cross-country, this Sandburg executed that plan. After the race was over, Sandburg had three all-state runners and a second state championship in the program's history. The Eagles scored 130 points to claim the championship.

While the race pace was hectic in the front, Sandburg took the comfortable pace to put them in a better position. Declan Tunney did his thing being towards the front. Then came their pack that just moved up in the middle of the race to shut the door on the rest of the field.

Tunney's fifth-place finish led the team. **Brock Rice** (19th) and **Sean Marquardt** (20th) ran together throughout both crossing the line in 14:48. **Grant Giblin** was the team's fourth runner in 49th. **Trent Anderson** was the team's fifth runner placing 58th. The team had a 46 second split.

The finish in this team race mirrored what happened the week before at an ever-tough Hinsdale Central Sectional. The Boys team of Hinsdale Central followed what their Girls team accomplished by finishing second with 175 points. **Daniel Watcke** earned all-state honors by finishing 14th running 14:46. Perhaps the surprise of this race came from **Aden Bandukwala**. The little-known sophomore was on Hinsdale Central's winning 4x400m Relay quartet at last June's IHSA State Track & Field Championship. What he did in the final mile was move from 45th to 29th to be the second runner on this team. It is the story that will become legendary in their program.

**Colby Revord** finished 36th ahead of teammates **Henry Gruber** (52nd) and **Abhinav Reddy** (75th). The top five split was 34 seconds. It was only 20 seconds from Bandukwala and Reddy.

Downers Grove North was only four points back in third with 179 points. It was even more amazing in how they accomplished that. Two of their top five runners **Caden Weber** and **Topher Ferris** was knocked down at the first turn in the race. They picked themselves up and moved up throughout the race.

That meant that the team needed to step up. The Trojans did have their top runner **Roy Llewellyn** step up to finish sixth overall. **Karan Shetty** finished 40th. **Kyle McNally**, who missed parts of this season due to injury, stepped up in a big way with his best race of the season running 15:08 to finish 42nd. Ferris and Weber finished incredibly in 60th and 61st to help their team to this trophy. North had a five-runner split of 46 seconds.

New Trier missed a trophy finishing fourth with 196 points led by Falk's finish and then a seven second split from their second through fifth runners. Oswego first appearance in the state meet in 27 years resulted in a fifth-place finish just one point behind New Trier with 197 points. **Ethan Forsell** earned all-state status by finishing 17th.


