LEAFS 2ND IN THE WESTERN BIG 6 X-C CONFERENCE MEET

On Thursday, October 14th, the Leafs traveled to Sterling's Hoover Park to participate in the Western Big-6 Cross Country Conference Meet. The field included teams from: East Moline (United Township), Galesburg, Geneseo, Moline, Quincy, Rock Island, Rock Island (Alleman), and Sterling, This is Geneseo's (and Sterling's) 3rd year as members of the Western Big 6 Conference. The Leafs placed 3rd in 2019 and won it last fall (2020.) The Western Big 6 Conference was established in 1969. The league expanded to eight teams in 2019-20. The a committee of administrators decided to keep the "Name Brand" Western Big 6 due to the tradition that the conference has achieved.

The meet consists of only two races. A Girls Race followed by a Boys Race. Having always been a member of conferences that ran "Lower Level" races such as F/S and JV Divisions, it has taken a while to adjust to the change. However, now that "The Dust has Settled", it is a nice change to have everyone on the team in one race. The Girls race started at 4:30 p.m. with the Boys race following by one hour.

The teams were treated to a tremendous Mid-October Day with a daytime high of 70°. The course was "Hard and Fast" despite rainfall during the previous week. I guess the ground was so dry it just "Soaked Up the Rain". There was virtually no wind and "Race-Time Temperatures were in the mid 60's. First Team All-Conference Honors were awarded to the "Top 10" Finishers. Second

Team All Conference Honors were awarded to places 11th through 20th. The Leafs entered the meet as the defending WB-6 Champions and were aiming at going "Back-to-Back". The Quincy Blue Devils entered the meet as Co-Favorites and all the pre-meet hype was accurate. Each team entered the race hoping to bring home the title. Excitement filled the air as all eight teams "Toed da Line" to usher in Championship Meet Racing Season.

Leading the way for the Leafs were Senior Justin Johnson (5th Place in 16:31) and Junior Gavin Allison (6th Place in 16:34). Justin and Gavin have traded off on the number one and two positions on the team all season long. Joining them on the First Team All-Conference Team was Junior Tyler Gehl who placed 9th overall and "Stopped the Clock" at 16:49. Joining in on the fun were Freshman Dylan Gehl (13th Place in 17:03), Sophomore Cooper Schaad (16th Place in 17:17), and Sophomore Sam Mosbarger (19th Place in 17:24.) Each man earned "2nd Team All-Conference Honors" by finishing in the Top 20. In case you haven't been counting, that's SIX Maple Leafs on the "All-Conference Teams". Way to Roll, Men.

Not far behind were: Senior Isaac Kuster (22nd Place in 17:38), Senior Malakai Schaad (45th Place in 18:28), Senior Carson Raya (53rd Place in 18:41), Junior Caleb Durian (63rd Place in 19:25), Sophomore Austin Hull (73rd Place in 19:48), Freshman Mason Anderson (78th Place in 20:09), Senior Simon Anderson (79th Place in 20:09), Junior Nathan Venneberg (81st Place in 20:12), Senior Andrew Burke (82nd Place in 20:23), Freshman Jacob Taylor (93rd Place in 22:01), Sophomore Ryley Rowold (95th Place in 22:19), Freshman Zach Meier (98th Place in 22:37), and Cameron Baumgardner (108th Place in 24:26.) Seven team members were unable to race due to injuries or conflicts. Those men included: Junior Karson Emry, Freshman Christian Haney, Sophomore Bryce Henderson, Freshman Max Johnson, Freshman Rylan Lambert, Freshman Taber Swanson, and Freshman Dylan Whipple.

When the "Dust Had Settled", the Quincy Blue Devils had come out on top to claim the WB6 Conference Championship with a score of 43. The Leafs were a close 2nd falling only 6 points short of the title. If the teams had tied, the Leafs would have won the meet on the "Tie Breaker" which is determined by whichever team had the highest placing 6th man. Last year, the Leafs winning total was 51 points (10 ahead of Moline.) The team scored two less points than last year. In addition, last year, the Leafs had 5 men in the first twenty (All-Conference) positions. This year they had SIX. The bottom line is the Leaf's didn't lose the meet.....Quincy Won It. Congratulations to the Quincy Blue Devils. They are a classy group of young men and we wish them all the best at the upcoming IHSA Regional, Sectional, and State Meets. The other "Lesson" to be learned is the fact that we can't achieve everything that we desire in life. In the words of Head Maple Leaf XC Coach Todd Ehlert "Dream Big" ANYWAY!!!. Let this narrow defeat inspire each and every one of us to strive to reach higher levels of commitment. The Price of Excellence isn't easily attained. The powerful combination of "Passion and Purpose" is key. Anyone who has ever participated in athletics has been "Knocked Down" before. The question isn't will it happen? The question is HOW QUICKLY WILL YOU GET BACK UP!!!

So what is next? Every team member who is NOT in the Varsity Top 7 will race for the final time this season on Tuesday, October 19th, at the Sterling O9/JV Invitational. The meet will take place

at Hoover Park. The Freshman race (girls and boys) will begin at 4:30 p.m. and Medals will be awarded to the Top 5 Male and Female Finishers. The rest of the team will compete in the JV (or Open Race) that will begin at 5:15 p.m. Both genders will race together with the Top 10 Male and Female Finishers earning Medals. Later in the week, the Leafs will travel to Galesburg's Lake Storey Park to participate in their assigned IHSA Regional Meet to be held on Saturday, October 23rd. The IHSA State Series limits each team to only seven runners. The Top 6 teams at the Regional Meet will advance to the IHSA Metamora Sectional to be contested at Metamora's Black Partridge Park on Saturday, October 30th. The Top 7 teams in that meet will advance to the STATE FINALS to be held at Peoria's Historic Detweiller Park on Saturday, November 6th. Keep "BRINGING IT" each and every day, Men. Great opportunities await.

Blue Devils sweep Big 6 championships

Geneseo boys, girls second; Miller and Veloz shine for UT

STERLING — Quincy quite literally ran away with the Western Big 6 cross country conference championships at Hoover Park in Sterling on Thursday.

But Geneseo and United Township made the Blue Devils work for it.

The girls' conference championship race was first, and

And out of the gate, it was close as Miller and Schuering separated themselves from the pack quickly. However, Schuering started to break away around the two-mile mark and never let

Miller finished second at 19:04.2, well behind Schuering's top time of 18:42.1, but 21 seconds ahead of third place.

"It's amazing to place second, it's a great feeling," Miller said. "Anna is great runner. I saw her up there, so I didn't slow down and I just tried to keep my eyes up on her. She pulled me through it. I'm happy with my place. There is nothing to be upset about in my opinion. It's great because I wanted to finish top three and I did. There is nothing else I could have asked for."

It was Miller's sixth top three finish this season. She set a new PR back on Aug. 11, with a time of 18:21.8, and is well in line to have a chance to advance in the postseason.

"This year we got a new coach and I began to trust his training and I did everything I had to do to get better," Miller said. "I put in the miles. I did the workouts. I showed up to practice and I prayed to God it would be a great season and it paid off. All those early mornings and late nights definitely worked."

The boys race came down to a competition between Quincy's Fiker Rosen and Sterling's Dale Johnson, with Rosen's kick at the end earning him his third win of the season and a conference championship at 15:18. Johnson came in right behind at 15:21.2.

The top metro runner was again from UT. The Panthers' Logan Veloz placed third with a time of 16:07.9. It was his fourth top three finish this season.

"It's a really rewarding finish because it's always been a goal of mine to be top five, and to get a podium finish is really, really cool," Veloz said. "I knew those two guys were really good; they are studs. I was just trying to keep pace with them as long as I could. I knew they would outlast me, but if I could try to stick with them for as long as I could, I knew they would pull me along to a good finish."

UT's Kade Rodgers (16:42.5) and Noah Van Damme (16:46.6) also finished inside the top 10 to earn all-conference recognition. But as a team, it was Geneseo that shined. The Maple Leafs had three top 10 finishers in the boys' race with Justin Johnson (16:31.7) placing fifth, Gavin Allison (16:34.8) in sixth and Tyler Gehl (16:49.2) earning ninth.

Those three performances, however, weren't quite enough to propel the Leafs (49) past Quincy (43) for the team conference championship. UT finished third.

"We had a great race today, but Quincy was awesome," Geneseo coach Todd Ehlert said. "They did a great job running. Our guys ran really well, we had a lot of personal bests and season bests, so I'm not disappointed in anyone's effort. Quincy just stepped up."

Quincy also swept the individual and team wins in the girls race. The Blue Devils finished with 28 points, 49 less than second place Geneseo (77). Moline (92) took third, followed by Alleman (104), Sterling (118), Rock Island (138) and United Township (146).

"Getting second in both races is awesome," Ehlert said. "We have had a great year so far, and it's going to continue next week hopefully. This should really help out. Regionals are tough, but hopefully we do really well down there and move on. That's always been the goal."

Other metro girls who earned all-conference for top 10 finishes include Moline's Alexis Havercamp (19:53.3) and Abby Debieck (20:07.1), Alleman's Clarissa Ostrowski (20:09.7) and Geneseo's Jaide Flowers (20:19.9).

At the end of the awards ceremony, it was announced that the coaches had voted Schuering and Ficker as the girls and boys WB6 Player of the Year.

IHSA Regionals will be held on Oct. 23 at various locations for each team. Times and opponents are still TBD.
