

## 2A Boys State Preview: Dixon Is Poised To Win State Crown

**Outlook:** This will be one of the best team races of the day. There are five teams with a legitimate chance to bring home the state title.

Dixon wasn't in the perch seat during the pre-season, but the Dukes steadily worked their way to the top and have looked the best of the bunch over the past few weeks and come in as the favorite. At the Lakes Sectional, it was a dominating 30-second split over #2 Deerfield that prevented any thought of an upset. Dean Geiger (Jr), Averick Wiseman (Jr), and Keegan Shirley (Sr) were top 10 finishers for the squad.

Mahomet-Seymour has the firepower to take the Dukes down with great pack running. If they are clicking on all cylinders, it will be close. Top runner Henry McMurry (Sr) will need to be the low stick, mixing it up with all of the other top dogs.

If this were a race where seven runners scored, Deerfield would be the heavy favorite as they have the best 6-7 runners in the class. But it's not. Jamie Chandler (Sr) has been the team ace all season long, and he was fourth at sectionals. The scoring pack will need to find a way to close the gap on him.

Morton and Peoria Notre Dame are also both absolutely loaded and could walk away with a state title if anyone has an off day. They are primed and ready for this epic team battle. Again, the 2A boys' race will be the highlight of the day!

The individual race will have so much firepower, it is entirely up in the air as to who will bring home the title. Some will say that Max Weber will come in as a marginal favorite after mowing through the competition this season. He dispatched most of his main rivals at the Mattoon Sectional, beating outstanding foes Quaid Berger (So., Richland Co) and Gabriel Greer (Jr., Marion).

Carson Kaiser (So., Kaneland) deserves more respect than he has been given. He has looked incredible over the past couple of weeks, with a dominating victory at the Lakes Sectional, which produced a state-leading time of 14:16. Although he won the very early-season First To The Finish Invitational in 14:28, he hasn't raced much or against the competition like some of the other candidates. However, he will be a force with the leading pack.

Thomas Jochum (Jr., Glenbard South) has come on strong the past couple of weeks and will also be in the mix for the individual title. Don't discount Greer, Maxwell Kirby (Jr., Peoria Notre Dame), or Judah Binger (So., Belvidere North) as these three have the talent to bring home the win as well. A sleeper pick is Liam Bettis (Jr) from Taylorville. He has been looking at this race all season as his goal, and is primed and ready to go for it. This is a battle royale that will keep fans on the edge until the finish!

## Team Preview -

All season we've been talking about one name above all, and the state meet is the time for **Dixon** to show us how dominant they are. They had an excellent show of force at the sectional with a 50 point win over #2 Deerfield. Their top three silenced any doubts that they won't show up in the postseason, and the addition of **Ethan Carter** has brought this team to the dominant plane they were expected at. **Averick Wiseman** and **Dean Geiger** will be all-state hopefuls, with **Keegan Shirely** floating around the all-state border. Shirely had an excellent race at the sectional, so his chances for claiming a high all-state spot are going up. Carter and **Westin Conaster** provide the support through five that the Dukes need, but after five is where they face the only uncertainty in their roster. Their sixth is **Abram Garcia**, who runs somewhere in the low 15:50s. In a normal year, that would be more than enough depth to solidify a win, but this is no normal year. The #2 and #3 teams, **Deerfield** and **Morton**, are historically deep teams that are on another level through seven runners. Deerfield has two solid lowsticks with **Jamie Chandler** and **Andrew Calderon** up front. Chandler will be in the running for a top 15 spot, Calderon will be aiming for a high all-state spot. After Calderon, the rest of their runners sit around 15:30, led by **Sam Chaban** and **Becket Shifrin**. Their sixth and seventh, **Scott Harvey** and **Hugo Albrecht-Buehler** both stomp on Dixon's sixth, with PRs of 15:42 and 15:45 apiece. Morton has almost an identical roster, with **Maxwell Carter** and **Keyston Beyer** up front looking for an all-state spot for each of them. **Abe Martin** has been in the hunt for all-state throughout the season, if he's on form, he could scoop up a spot by Beyer and Carter. Behind Martin, **Owen Riesberg** and **Isaiah Hartter** provide support through 5. Their sixth runner, **Duke Hendrick** runs 15:47 which creates support behind Hartter should one of the top 5 have a rough day. Both Deerfield and Morton have incredible depth, but their firepower up front doesn't quite match up with Dixon's. So let's meet the one team that could potentially outright beat Dixon with their weapons up front.

**Mahomet Seymour** had two weeks in a row where they legitimately looked like they would go toe to toe with Dixon. **Adam Smigelski** has been on a heater lately, dropping PRs on courses that are 15-20 seconds slower than Detweiller. His race at the sectional meet further solidifies his spot in the top 3 for the Bulldogs, after taking eighth in one of the strongest individual sectionals in 2A. **Tate Bode** was the third runner for MS for the majority of the season, and he could still be up with Smigelski on a good day. **Tayten Gergen** has also made a similar jump to Smigelski, with a new PR of 15:22 that he ran at the conference meet. The only uncertainty here is with their top two runners, **Augustus Gaudio** and **Henry McMurry**. Gaudio and McMurry tied for the final all-state spot last fall, but neither have looked like those two runners this season. McMurry had a glimpse of that character at the Richard Spring invite, with a solid mark of 14:49, but since then, neither one has looked as insane as they were expected to be. If these two can prove that they are still the elite athletes that they were last fall, and they are able to push up towards **Dean Geiger** and **Averick Wiseman** of Dixon, then Mahomet Seymour will be in title contention. There's one more team that you can't forget, and that's **Peoria Notre Dame**. Led by a potential top five finisher in **Maxwell Kirby**, this team fits the bill for a trophy team in every aspect. They have a solid pack in the 15:20-15:30 range, with **Luke Fady**, **Joshua Stedwill**, **Dax Duffy** and **John Baker**. Their sixth, **Freddie Couri**, has been solid around the 15:50s, but has been a scoring force in a number of meets this year. They were only two points back from Morton at the sectional meet, but people forget that they won First to the Finish over Morton and Deerfield as well as taking down Mahomet Seymour at Richard Spring. This team has had success already, but they will need an A+ day in order to bring a trophy home. If one of these

teams wants to take the title, they will need two things: everything to go right for them, and something to go wrong for Dixon. If one of Dixon's top 5 falters, all four teams will be waiting like sharks in the water, ready to attack at the first sign of weakness. The only exception is Mahomet Seymour, who could just straight up out-muscle Dixon if they have an insane day. However, with that all said, the expectation is never that someone will not show up on the day. You always expect the best of every athlete at the state meet, and Dixon's best clears whatever anyone else can put up. They have been the favorites all year, so don't expect them to give in now.

## Individual Preview -

Every single day, I have gone back and forth on who I think will win this race. It's genuinely impossible to pick, because everyone towards the front runs a similar race style to each other. You have to nitpick every single aspect of a runners game to see who will win this race. From the perspective of an analyst, it looks to be a four man race, but you could see as many as 7 to 8 guys competing for the title. The four horsemen of 2A's doom consist of **Max Weber** of Civic Memorial, **Thomas Jochum** of Glenbard South, **Quaid Berger** of Olney Richland County, and **Carson Kaiser** of Kaneland. Between these four, you couldn't pick a favorite if you tried. Jochum is coming off of an all time performance at his sectional, when he broke a Donald Sage record at the Fenton course for a time of 14:49. For those of you who don't know, Donald Sage is the 3200 state record holder, with a time of 8:40 which he ran at the state meet in the early 2000s. His 3 mile PR is a 14:00, and Jochum beat one of his records. That is an unreal level of confidence to have going into the state meet, he will be riding the high of that performance throughout this race. Berger has been running times that have genuinely blown me away, with a PR of 14:33 at FTTF in the 90 degree heat. He has repeated that result on courses that are roughly 15-20 seconds slower than Detweiller, which shows just how fit he is. The only stain on his resume going into the state meet is his loss to Weber at sectionals and his loss to Kaiser at FTTF. Weber and Kaiser are the only two who are toting undefeated records coming into the state meet, one of them will have to lose that streak. Weber spends his time in the southern half of the state, he actually races Missouri competition more than he races Illinois competition. The most relevant competition he's had was during the postseason, where he won the Mattoon sectional over Berger, **Gabriel Greer** of Marion, and **Liam Bettis** of Taylorville. Kaiser has also spent his season undefeated, but he has dropped the fastest mark of the field with a 14:16 at the sectional meet. He demolished the field at sectionals, taking his win by over 25 seconds. All four of these runners will be right next to each other, it's going to be tantalizingly close. Behind them, there is an avalanche of talent that will fill the next few spots. **Cuyler Swanson** of Morris will lead the chasers, he should be able to hang with the top guys for most of this race. He had an excellent race at the sectional meet, running 15:01 on a pretty slow Geneseo course. **Maxwell Kirby** of Peoria Notre Dame was right after Swanson at Geneseo, with a time of 15:04. Kirby ran 14:29 at Richard Spring earlier in the year, and he has maintained that all the way through to the postseason. You also can't forget about **Gabriel Greer**, who still boasts one of the fastest times in 2A with a 14:22. He was a pack ahead of Kirby at Richard Spring when he set that time, but he hasn't looked quite as strong since that 14:22 performance. **Liam Bettis** of Taylorville was right with Greer at 14:23, but he has also been on a downward trend since that mark. His sectional race was a little concerning, as he was over 30 seconds back from Greer and over 40 seconds back from Weber. We'll see what he can pull together at the state meet, he still has a shot at all-state. **Judah Binger** of Belvidere North is having a sensational season as well, with times in the low 14:40s. He will be looking to join the others in the top ten. Other guys like **Ellery Shutt** of Woodstock and **Zach Born** of Metamora love to show up on state meet day and crush expectations, so watch out for them to be x-factors in this race. There are simply too many names that could drop huge times in this race to mention them all, so you're just gonna have to watch the race yourself to see who's got what it takes.

The sport of Cross-Country running and its participants have often been labeled as boring and bland to the general sports fan. In most cases, that is a true statement. But here comes the Dukes of Dixon, a collection of happy-go-lucky teenagers who chose the sport of long-distance running. When you enter their team camp, it's usually dance or uptempo music on the dial. Maybe it's the confidence or bravado the Dukes exhibit that catches your attention, but it makes this sport fun to watch.

The starting seven of Dean Geiger (Jr), Averick Wiseman (Jr), Keegan Shirley (Sr), Ethan Carter (Fr), Westin Conatser (Sr), Abram Garcia (Fr), and Alonzo Bautista (Fr) were not preseason #1 by MileSplit IL. This talent, but unproven, made their angst known through a series of trolling, send-off men mentions, and social media fan messengers to let the powers that be know that the Dukes were the kings of 2A. It was the fiery hot second half of the season that propelled them into the top spot.

Coming into Peoria, the eyes were on the Dukes as well as several other teams by way of Deerfield, Morton, Mahomet-Seymour, and Peoria (Notre Dame).

Geiger and Wiseman got out well and established the tone for the rest of the scoring pack. The Dukes led at the first mile with 87 points. It was a 12-second scoring spread, which is a coach's dream!

Among the massive pack of runners that traversed through the first mile were Max Weber (Sr., Civic Memorial) and Carson Kaiser (So., Maple Park Kaneland) in 4:41.

The pace stayed comfortable through the next checkpoint, which was the 1.5-mile breakpoint. Quaid Berger (So., Richland County) was the official leader in 7:07.

At the second mile, it was still anyone's race; this time, Thomas Jochum (Jr., Glenbard West) was in front at 9:30.2. He was hardly in control as nearly a dozen runners were within six seconds.

Geiger, Shirley, and Wiseman were among the top 25 in the scoring department for the Dukes. Their team score ballooned slightly to 106 points. Fortunately for them, it didn't hurt them as Mahomet-Seymour remained at 147 with one mile left.

Weber indicated that his final launch zone was the 1000m, but he was not comfortable with that plan. He called a mental audible and moved with 600m. He ditched Kaiser, Jochum, and Berger but not Gabriel Greer (Jr., Marion). Greer is a quiet guy with a big heart.

Weber's kick proved too smooth as he darted up the incline and checked his shoulders for reassurance. The victory was his in 14:08. Greer enjoyed an excellent consolation prize- 14:10. Kaiser was third in 14:12. The fourth finisher welcomed Jochum in 14:15, and Berger closed out the top five in 14:18.

Dixon executed their plan like a masterpiece, with all five scorers among the top 50, ending the show with 115 points. Geiger and Wiseman were 14th and 20th overall to earn all-state honors.

## LEAFS PLACE 25th IN 2A BOYS STATE FINAL

On Saturday, November 8th, the Leafs traveled to Peoria's "Historic" Detweiller Park to participate in the IHSA STATE FINALS. This is the 6th straight year that the team has accomplished the feat. That is a program record. The previous "Streaks" of 4 were accomplished when there were either two classes (Geneseo was in the large class which was called AA) and when there was only one class. There are currently 3 classes and the Leafs compete in the middle division. Several sports have 4 classes (Basketball, Baseball, Softball, Volleyball, and Wrestling. They also award 4 team trophies in each division. Cross Country and Track and Field (other sports too) only have 3 classes and only award 3 team trophies in each class. Football has 8 classes. I understand why football needs 8 but I don't understand why all other sports don't have the same number of classes and team trophies. Just my two cents. Anyway, congratulations to Coaches Ehlert & Brown and the Geneseo Maple Leafs for making "History". We are Very Proud of each of you.

On to the racing. The daytime high was in the low 50's. The race time temperature was 49°. There was a minimal wind (5 mph) and a bit of drizzle during the 2A and 3A races. The course was Hard and Fast. It was a great day to race. It was estimated that over 20,000 fans were in

attendance during the meet. WOW!!! The Detweiller Park course is the closest thing we can use as "School Records". All of the other courses that the team races on have been changed over the years so the current course listings don't include many years. Detweiller Park has served as the IHSA State Meet 3 mile course since the fall of 1971. The two class system began in the fall of 1976. Sadly, girls weren't allowed to compete until the fall of 1971. Things have changes a LOT since those days. It's crazy to me to think that the girls weren't allowed to compete because it was thought to be too strenuous for them. Unbelievable.

The 2A boys race started at "High Noon". The Leafs entered the meet and were picked by "Athletic.Net" to place 25th overall. That is based on "season best times" over a 3 mile course. It doesn't factor in anything other than that. No hills, environmental conditions, etc. The Leafs "Toed the Line" with 4 Seniors (The 4 Horsemen) and 3 Sophomores (The Super-Sophs). The field included teams from: Aurora (Central Catholic), Aurora (Aurora Marmion Academy), Bellalto (Civic Memorial), Chicago (Lake View), Chicago (Latin), Crystal Lake (Central), Darien (Hinsdale Central), Dixon, Deerfield, Elmhurst (Timothy Christian), Geneseo, Glenn Lynn (Glenbard South), Herrin, Highland, LaGrange Park (Nazareth Academy), Lombard (Montini), Mahomet (M-Seymour), Maple Park (Kaneland), Marion, Metamora, Morris, Morton, Mt. Vernon, Niles (Northridge Prep), Normal (University High), Peoria (Notre Dame), Taylorville, & Washington.

Henley Bourne led the Maple Leaf efforts via his 80th place finish. He destroyed his personal best on the course by 44 seconds as he "Roared" to a lifetime best of 15:29. That time moved him into the 16th place on the GHS individual Top 25 list for the course. He also became the 3rd fastest GHS Sophomore EVER. Great Stuff, Henley. It is time to start preparing to make a run at some "All-State" Hardware. The Top 25 finishers in each race earn that honor. That would be a great goal to chase. All the best in attaining it. Also, congratulations on an amazing sophomore season. You have a chance to become one of Geneseo's greatest runners before you graduate. Carpe Diem!

Next up was Senior Leader Jaxson Sottos. Jaxson sprinted across the finish line in 15:45, barely missing his lifetime best time of 15:43 set at last year's state meet. "JJ" struggled over the summer and didn't get a lot of mileage in. However, he "Caught On Fire" during the 2nd half of the season and did a wonderful job of providing omnipotent leadership to the team. Every athletic career has "Peaks and Valleys". The key is to keep moving forward. He did that to the best of his ability. He owns the 19th fastest time in GHS history (Top 25 Individual List...any grade level). His time of 15:45 moved him into 15th place on the GHS Senior Top 25 list. He placed 115th overall in the talented field. He also joined an elite list of GHS athletes to compete in 4 straight IHSA State Finals. Great Job, Jaxson. All the best in Track.

Next up was "Super-Soph" Greyson Claerhout who "Broke the Tape" in a lifetime best of 16:22. His time took over a minute (1:07) off of his Detweiller Park personal best and placed him 170th overall in the talented field. His time moved him into 19th place on the GHS Sophomore Top 25 list for the course. Greyson had a tremendous "Break Out" season. It is very exciting to see what Greyson "and da boys" will accomplish in the coming years. A return trip to the IHSA State Finals is certainly on the "To Do List". The upcoming Track season should be a lot of fun too. The dude is literally "On Fire". Stay hungry and keep paying the price that excellence demands. DREAM BIG!

Senior Leader Graysen Carlson was the next Maple Leaf to cross the finish line. He "Stopped the Clock" at 16:23 and placed 172nd in the deep field. His time was a personal best on the Detweiller Park course by 7 seconds. He barely missed a lifetime best for 3 miles by 3 seconds (he ran 16:20 at the Limestone Regional). Pretty amazing stuff for a dude racing with a "Nasty" case of shin splints. His pain threshold is obviously very high. Great job of leading by example, Graysen. Also, thanks for all of the great Senior leadership you have provided the team. All the best during the Track season and beyond. Graysen is planning on competing in college. Your best races are still ahead of you. Carpe Diem!

Fellow Senior Leader Aidan Bries was the next Maple Leaf to sprint across the finish line. Aidan ran a lifetime best of 16:29 and placed 178th overall in the talented field. Aidan improved his Detweiller best by 18 seconds. Great Stuff, Aidan. He has battled illness and injury during his high school career and it was awesome to watch him run the best race of his life when it mattered the most. In the State Finals. Congratulations on a tremendous high school career (which isn't over yet....Track season is going to ROCK). He also joined an elite list of GHS athletes to compete in 4 straight IHSA State Finals. Thank You for being such an impactful team leader over the years. Then you "Upped Your Game" this year. Well done, Aidan. The "Four Horsemen" are going to leave some pretty big shoes to fill.

Senior Leader Kaden Elmer was the "Next Man up for the Leafs". Kaden also ran a lifetime best of 16:50 and placed 199th in the talented field. Kaden took 10 seconds off of his Detweiller Park personal best. Way to Go, Kaden. Running his best XC race in the State Finals is AWESOME. There is simply no better way to lead than by example. You have provided great leadership to the team on a daily basis. He also joined an elite list of GHS athletes to compete in 4 straight IHSA State Finals. In case you're not counting...that makes 3 Maple Leafs on GHS Team that accomplished that feat. That is "Jaw-Dropping". The "Four Horsemen" have left their mark. Thanks for always being such a great guy. Hopefully, you're not done yet. Nail Track!!!

The final Leaf on the day to cross the finish line was "Super-Soph" Kael McCord. Kael, also, ran a lifetime best in the State Finals. Kael "Crushed" his Detweiller best by almost a minute (50 seconds). He was timed in 16:51 and placed 201st in the "Loaded Field". That's right....All 7 Maple Leafs "Cracked" the 17:00 barrier. Great Stuff, Men. It is going to be A LOT of fun watching Kael and his teammates chase their potential in the coming years. Keep Dreaming BIG. Then, back those dreams up with the commitment that excellence demands. All the best in Track and Field season. You have broken through to a new level of achievement. Keep re-setting your goals. Hopefully, you and "da Boys" will be back in the State Finals next year. That has to be the goal. TEAM!!

What a day. All 6 races were amazing. The great conditions held up all day long and the times were "Smoking" in every race. It was truly a historic day. Last year, 99 boys broke the magical 15:00 barrier. That used to be "A Lock" to earn "All-State" honors. Not any more. This year 117 boys broke 15:00. That is amazing. Oberfell took charge right away, possessing a two-second lead at the first mile checkpoint in 4:41 over Caiden Cook (Jr., Duquoin).

Expecting to run in the low 14:20s, Oberfell was 7:19 at the halfway point. He was on pace to run under 14:30, possibly better than 14:25 if he could maintain his pace over the second half of the race.

At the second mile marker, Oberfell's lead grew to 13 seconds over the field, passing in 9:34.

Oberfell covered the final mile in 4:47, cruising through the finish line and improving on his season best with a time of 14:32.

Knobloch held off a hard-charging Blake McLeese (Sr., Tuscola) 14:46.3 to 14:46.5 for the runner-up spot. In some ways, McLeese's effort was a victory after finishing 126th in last year's sectional round.

Luca Bryja (Sr., Elgin Christian Academy) finished fourth in 14:48, and Elijah Teevey (Sr., Pleasant Plains) completed the top five in 14:49.

#1 Eureka sleptwalked throughout the qualifying round. The Hornets lost to Elmwood at sectionals, and the feeling was that it would be more of the same at state.

Eureka had the advantage of running a tight pack that had run under 30 seconds numerous times. In a larger field, that could be an advantage. The Hornets led at the first mile by 13 points over Elmwood. Things began to tighten up over the second mile, dropping to two points 155-157.

Senior Gavin Stalter would eventually finish 23rd overall. However, it was the fifth runner, Timothy Rogers (Sr.), picking up 11 spots in the final mile, which placed him 60th, bringing his teammates home with another title.
