<p>Listen to 5 different songs on the radio. How do they make you feel? Write 2 sentences About each Song.</p> 	<p>Sing a song you know for a grown up in your house! Can you teach them part of your song so they can perform with you? Can you add actions to it?</p>	<p>Watch this video an amazing beatboxer. Do you think you could do that one day? Write a paragraph about what you liked or didn't like.</p> <p><a href="#">Tom Thum TedX</a></p>	<p>Ask a grown up or a family member what style of music they like to listen to. See if they will play some for you. How does it sound? Do you like it, too?</p>	<p>Ask a grown up if you can explore the Chrome Music Lab and try some different Musical Experiments!</p> <p><a href="#">Chrome Music Lab</a></p>
<p>Watch one show on TV or a video. Do you hear music at all? Make a list of the times you heard music. If you didn't hear any, do you think music would have made it better?</p>	<p>Try learning this song and doing the claps with it. It's like a tongue twister for your hands!</p> <p><a href="#">Bim Bum Song</a></p>	<p>Watch an animated movie (with permission) and try to think about how the music makes the movie more exciting. Does the music affect the mood?</p>	<p>Make a list of your top ten places that you enjoy listening to music. Ask someone else in your home to do the same, and then compare your lists.</p>	<p>Add different amounts of water to two (or more) GLASS drinking glasses, and tap them gently with a metal spoon. Are the sounds the same or different?</p>
<p>Go outside for 15 minutes, &amp; keep track of how many nature sounds you hear, and how many man-made sounds you hear. Guess which one you will hear more of!</p>	<p>I bet you ALL know the song "Baby Shark". Can you sing it 4 different ways? Quietly, Loudly, Slowly, and Quickly.</p> <p><a href="#">Baby Shark Song</a></p>	<p>FREE SPACE</p> <p>Pick something musical All on your own!</p>  <p>I'm sure it will be GREAT!</p>	<p>Watch this video. <a href="#">Marble Music Machine</a> What would your musical machine look like? Draw a picture of it or write a paragraph to describe how it would work.</p>	<p>Listen to a piece of music you really like. Make a work of art (drawing, painting, etc) that expresses how the music makes you feel.</p>
<p>Ask a grown-up what their favorite song is, and why it's their favorite, and then ask if they can play it for you to hear. Do you like it, too? Why or why not?</p>	<p>Sing 3 songs while looking into a mirror. Do you have good posture? Stand up straight and tall. Watch your face while you sing. Are you fun to watch?</p>	<p>Try to think of a song for each of these emotions: Happiness, Sadness, Anger, and Fear. Do certain songs make you feel a certain way?</p>	<p>Watch and Listen to this! <a href="#">PINK! by Rocknoceros</a> What is YOUR favorite color? Make up a song about your favorite color and sing it for 2 different people!</p>	<p>Ask a grown up to put some different objects into a plastic egg. See if you can use your listening ears to guess what is inside of the eggs without looking!</p>
<p>Listen to music for 15 minutes on the radio. Make a list of all of the different instruments you can identify. See if you can get to 10!</p>	<p>Think of your favorite song and sing it for someone in your home. Tell them why you like it so much!</p>	<p>Watch this short film with no sound. Can you tell what's happening?
